SPORT FUNDING 2013/14

Our indicative Primary PE and Sport Funding for 2013/14 is £8,000 plus £5 per pupil. Schools will be given 65% this year and 35% next year.

Targets for 2013-14

- Provide training for play leaders to introduce playground games at breaks and lunchtimes.
- Ensure that more pupils access competitive inter-school sport
- Increase the quality of PE Lessons
- Ensure that all pupils can swim at least 25m by the end of KS2
- School to participate in more events organised through the School Sports Partnership

Anticipated Impact measures:

- An increase in the number of pupils taking part in after school sport
- the increase and success in competitive school sports
- the growth in the range of traditional and alternative sporting activities
- the improvement in partnership work on physical education with other schools and other local partners
- links with other subjects that contribute to pupils' overall achievement and their greater social, spiritual, moral and cultural skills
- Greater awareness amongst pupils about the dangers of obesity, smoking and other such activities that undermine pupils' health.
- Quality of overall provision to improve so that all teaching in this area is at least 'Good' or better.

Evaluation/Impact of targets:

- Provide training for play leaders to introduce playground games at breaks and lunchtimes.
Action moved to 2014/15
- Ensure that more pupils access competitive inter-school sport
85% of children across the school attended clubs. 65% attended competitive competitions.
- Increase the quality of PE Lessons
All teachers received CPD throughout the year to develop their teaching of Gymnastics. 90% of lessons were rated as good or outstanding.
- Ensure that all pupils can swim at least 25m by the end of KS2
Children who did not achieve their 25m have been asked to attend further swimming lessons with school.
- School to participate in more events organised through the School Sports Partnership
As a school we participated in more competitions than before.
