Mutual Respect

- Our PSHE curriculum embodies values of Mutual Respect through units of learning such as Relationships and Being a Responsible Citizen.
- Our full time Sports Teaching Assistants actively promote an attitude of equality and fairness.
- Our Year 6 and Reception Buddies scheme promotes mutual respect between pupils across different phases of school.

Democracy

- Children are involved in the Democratic process. They vote for school councillors and hold Class Council meetings.
- The school council is overseen by staff members who ensure that it adheres to a democratic process.
- Children from school council attend governing body meetings to report their actions.
- Children are educated about the democratic process and in 2015 all KS2 children took part in a mock-election.

The Rule Of Law

- We have links with many agencies including Police, Fire and Drugs services.
- We have a clearly structured behaviour policy which all stakeholders understand and follow.
- We regularly review behaviour incidents in school and share these with key stakeholders.

Tolerance of those of different faiths and beliefs

- We have a growing number of E.A.L children and actively use school resources to promote their learning and integration into our school society.
