English

Last term we were learning about non-chronological reports. You could create your own report about a topic of your choice - animals and their habitats like we did in school, or books, toys, even food that you like or places that you have visited!

If you would like to be more practical, you could read the report as though you are a news reader. You could present it to the people in your house or get a grown up to record it and then you can send it to family and friends!

Remember, non-chronological reports include titles, sub-titles, facts and images. Be as creative as you can!
