Key text: The Highwayman

Work around the poem will involve discussions about the characters, what happens in the poem, whilst also gaining an understanding of new vocabulary. This information will then be applied to several short writes.

Maths

Focus Area: Volume and Roman Numerals

Applying our knowledge of times tables and cubed numbers to find the volume of cubes and cuboids.

Arithmetic Focus: Division

Enquiry Question: How do volcanoes affect the lives of people on Hiemaey?

The children will analyse the impact of volcanoes in certain areas of the world and recognise how people adapt to be able to live near them.

Science

Focus Area: Living things and their habitats.

The children will continue to learn about the life cycles of plants and animals and the various stages that they go through.

RE

Enquiry Question: What is the best way for a Christian to show commitment to God?

The focus of the topic will involve children recognising and understanding what is meant by the term 'commitment' and how they demonstrate this on a day-to-day basis on a personal level. Following this, discussions will focus on how Christians show commitment to God through their religious practices and the reasons why they do so.



PE

The children will be participating in learning associated with orienteering. Alongside this they will undertake a Gymnastics topic, which will build on the skills of balance and travelling from the previous year. This will then result in both travelling and balances being combined to form sequences.

Spanish La Familia

Continue to count in Spanish, reaching 100. This will then enable them to put numbers into context when they move onto verbally being able to state the age of various family members.

PSHCE Changing Me

The children will be involved in taking part in discussions on the changes that they go through as they get older.
