Maths

Focus Area:

For our first topic, we will be learning about the place value of numbers up to 10 million. This will include reading, identifying, comparing and ordering numbers.

Then we will move on to the four operations, including addition, subtraction, multiplication and division. The children will mainly be working on formal written methods for multiplication and division but will also learn how to solve problems with more than one operation.

RE

Enquiry Question: What is the best way for a Muslim to show commitment to God? We'll be investigating the religion of Islam - Viewing the focus of commitment how the followers of this religion show commitment to their God.



PE

Learning different passing techniques and thinking when we should use these passes in a competitive situation.

History and Geography

Enquiry Question: Why was winning the Battle of Britain, in June 1940, so important?

Using a range of sources, we will be analysing statistics, data, and accounts from witnesses to develop an understanding of why Britain won and why this was important for Britain going forward.

Enquiry Question: Why are mountains so important?

Locating and identifying mountain ranges on a map and using technical vocabulary to explain how mountains are formed.

Science

Focus Area: Animals including Humans:

We will be learning all about the human body, the circulation system, and the heart. We will also learn how to keep our body and its systems healthy. During this topic, the children will plan and conduct investigations around the human body and will record and present their results.

Spanish

Pets: Children will learn to present both orally and in written form about the pets they have and/or do not have.

The children will describe key features in music and understand features of at least 4 different types/genres of music.
