An amazing addition!



SEND SPEAK!

There are lots of terms used when speaking and writing about SEND. We will share a couple on each newsletter!

This term:

- POP Pupil Overview of Progress. This is the plan that
 tells you and all the people working with your chid what
 is in place to support their whole development. You will
 get a copy at the start of each term and invited in for
 a meeting to discuss targets with the class teacher.
- EHCP Educational Healthcare Plan. Some children will need additional support and Lancashire County Council will assess if an EHCP needs to be in place to provide more support to the child, family and school.



Spotlight Question

My child has been put on the SEND register and I have been told they are being put forward for an Educational Healthcare Needs Assessment.

What happens next?

In occasions where children require further support than what school can provide alone, the SEND team may decide that a needs assessment is appropriate. This decision is made with our Educational Psychologist and Specialist Teacher. School has to complete a series of forms and submit lots of evidence. You will get a copy of the form to sign and parental views to complete. Please return these as soon as possible. Once this has been submitted, it is up to Lancashire County Council Inclusion Team to make the decision. You will be sent letters directly from them. This should take around 16 weeks from submission. Please ask Mrs Atkin or Mrs Staples for an update if you haven't heard anything.
